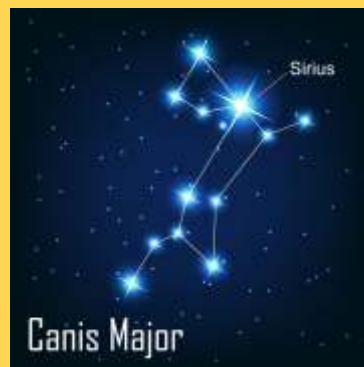
To Canis Constellation & the future of Ganja

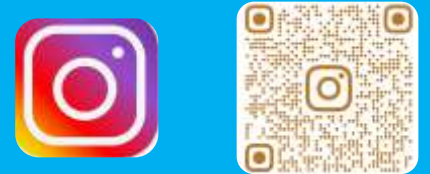

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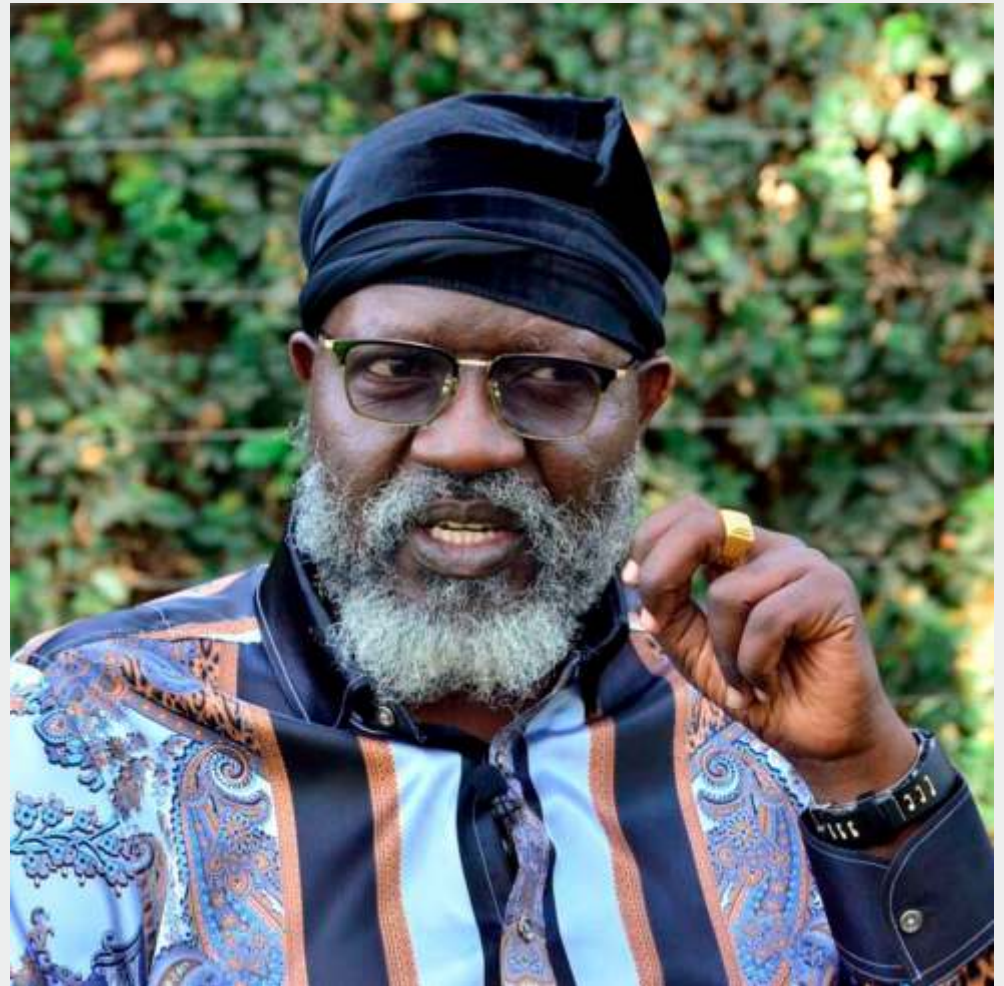


PRESIDENTIAL HOPEFUL HIGH ON WEED MOVES

2022 UN World Drug report: Statistically Sound, Socially Silent.

Ghada Waly, the Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime stated in the preface of the post Covid-19 World Drug report that "the illicit drug cultivation offers no way out for impoverished communities in the long run". In the report the term 'drug' comes with disclaimers in these reports with a clarification that "the term 'drug use' in the World Drug Report refer to substances controlled under the international drug control conventions, and their non-medical use". Cannabis is somehow found in the same frame of International regulation and hence the sovereign practice in states deciding their own relational framework with the cannabis plant.

The report states that they have witnessed a change in "perceptions of cannabis harms" which have decreased

in areas where the "drug" has been legalized. Whilst remaining in the validation of regulating cannabis due to the fact that it can be prone to abuse, the harms are indicated with no fluctuations with regard to the ground detail on which these numbers emanate. We see a clear indication on referral terms where the reports states that; "early indications suggest that cannabis legalization has had a wide-ranging impact on public health and safety, market dynamics, commercial interests and criminal justice responses", the subject is clear legalised markets. In the case of harms there seems to be no isolation or separation in indications that this framework is couples both the dark web and the white labelled weed.

The report further anchors that "Cannabis remains by far the world's most used drug", estimating that 209

million people used cannabis in 2020, representing 4 per cent of the global population an indication that since the world cup was in Africa "the number of people who use cannabis has increased by 23 per cent". Stating that use remained the highest in North America, where 16.6 per cent of the population use the "drug". With indications that Cannabis remains the main drug of concern for the majority of people.

A win for the plant in this era of resurgence is the acknowledgement in the report that "Cannabis cultivation is reported to be on the increase in 2020, seizures of cannabis resin increased to a record high in 2020, seizures of cannabis herb increased substantially in 2020, following a downward trend over the last decade, driven by large decreases in seizures in North America". Take not of the substantial

referral to cannabis in its native state "the herb", they know the names but more so that the herb is leaping in growth.

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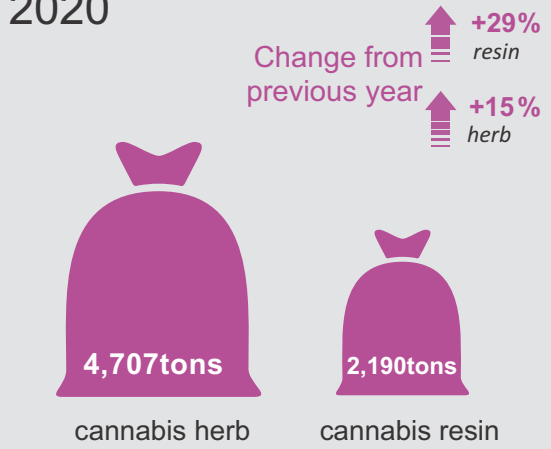

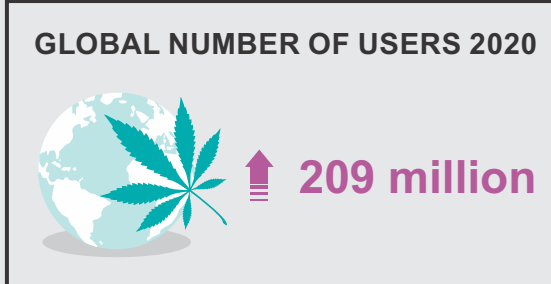
This is due in part to the increase in the carbon footprint of indoor cannabis cultivation which is stated to be considerably larger than that of outdoor cannabis cultivation (between 16 to 100 times higher) now that's a lead for the power companies. The Covid-19 timeline will stand as one of the watershed periods for all humanity, which ever front one stood on. For the Ganja plant the times of lockdown "during the COVID-19 pandemic drove increases in the use of cannabis, in terms of both amounts used and frequency of use, in 2020". The modalities stated pushed Pot to a pole position where the plant is said to "account for a substantial share of global drug-related harm, owing in part to its high prevalence rates. Some 40 per cent of countries reported cannabis as the 'drug' associated with the greatest number of drug use disorders, and 33 per cent reported it as the main drug of concern for those in drug treatment". In observing the emerging markets indicators point to wide-ranging impacts of cannabis legalization in jurisdictions in North America on public health, public safety, market dynamics, commercial interests and criminal justice responses. When looking back at Africa we find present once again the biggest consumer as "the use of cannabis is

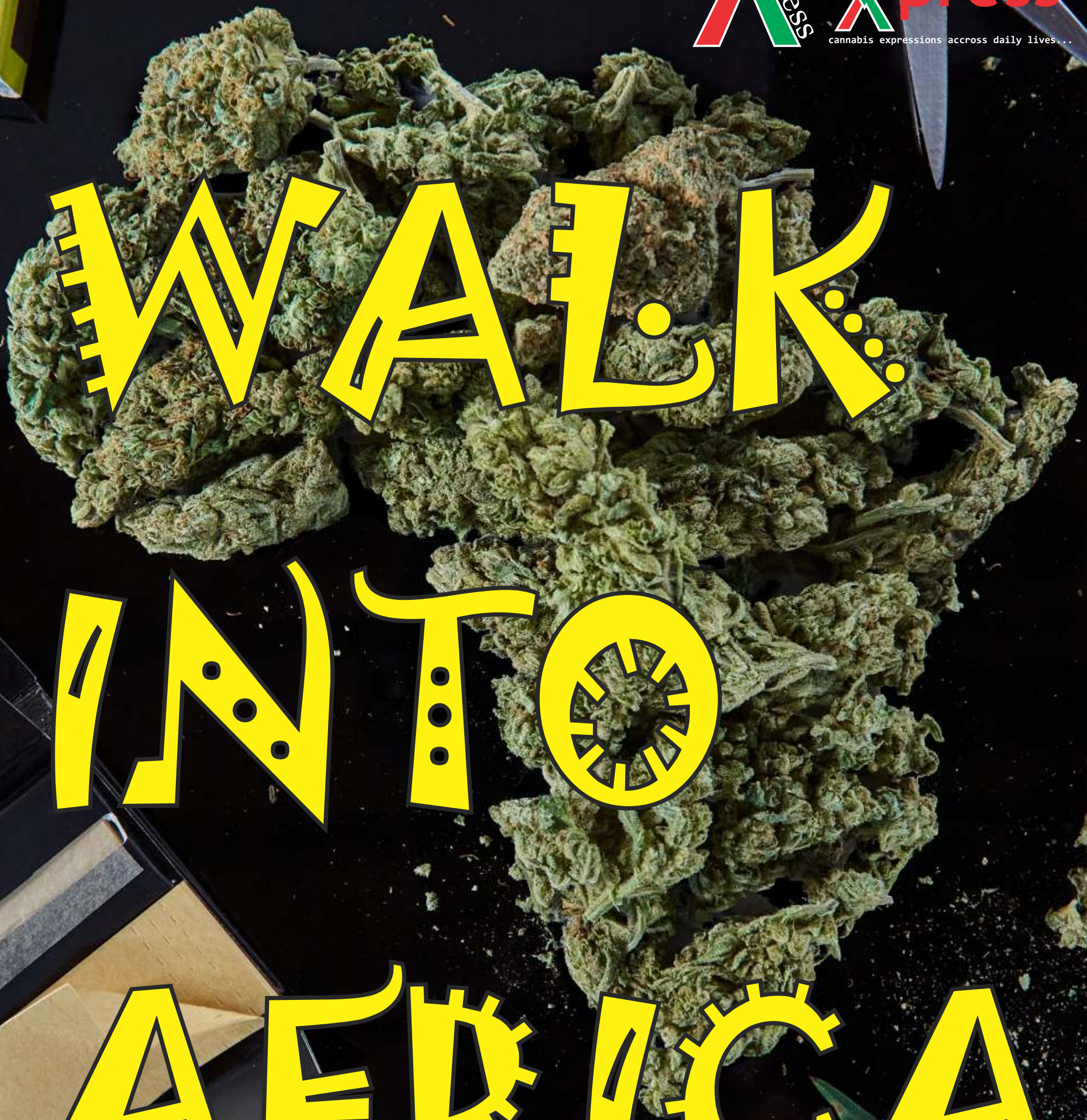
GLOBAL SEIZURES 2020



particularly high in West and Central Africa, with past-year prevalence of use of nearly 10 per cent (28.5 million people), largely reflecting prevalence of cannabis use in Nigeria. Consumption does come with the money but this time the report reroutes the end user, powered by Morocco; "North Africa is a hub for interregional cannabis resin smuggling to Western Europe" this is in part facilitated by the cannabis use gender gap that is narrowing, notably in North America, where the level of use is particularly high. In the patriarch remains that retained the culture of masculinity "a large gender gap in the use of drugs, with 1 woman for 9 men using cannabis" in Africa. The World Drug report further states that "Cannabis legalization appears to have accelerated the upwards trends in reported daily use of the drug, with a pronounced increase in reported frequent use of high-potency products among young adults. In contrast, the prevalence of cannabis use among adolescents has not changed much. The proportion of people with psychiatric disorders and suicides associated with regular cannabis use has increased, as has the number of hospitalizations due to cannabis use disorders. Cannabis products have diversified, and average levels of THC in the various cannabis products have continued to increase, to levels up to 60 per cent in some markets."

The growing influence and investments of large corporations, including those in the alcohol and tobacco sectors, is evident in the legal cannabis industry. Tax revenues from the legalized market have continued to rise. The illegal cannabis market is shrinking in some jurisdictions, but it continues to exist alongside legal markets. Legalization has led to a major reduction in the number and rates of arrest of people for cannabis-related offences. However, since possession of cannabis remains a criminal offence for minors, legalization has not led to a substantial reduction in youth arrest rates. The tale is that of checks and balances, we live in a dual world and whilst the positive is aspired for there is a negative to endure. The report does show financial wins in the legal roll out of the cannabis plant but is silent to what formulated the opening remarks on the social front with remedial stated as measures to avoid the exclusions of the descendants from impoverished and marginalised communities as the years of legalisation churn on.





WALK INTO AFRICA



CHAIRS & CANNA OFFICES A NEW NORMAL

As the cannabis industry begins to unfold like the mature reveal of the lotus flower, so to, is the reality in the rise of new boards and Ganja causes. The game of chairs is beginning to mainline the cannabis plant business as was the case with the capitalisation of alcohol; remembering that once like the Cannabis plant it faced an uphill task of prohibition when approaching the consumer.

However, more than names and positions is the reflection that the development of official systematic patterns represents, as early indications of sustainability and potential at the onset of motion into an industry of the past, now promising a high future. The government of South Africa has been key in continually formulating structures around the suspended legislation and proposed cannabis frameworks. One of the

pioneering units that emerged as the cannabis community merged its lobby was the CDCSA (Cannabis Development Council of South Africa), from here the cannabis people in South Africa have opened their eyes to new groupings and consulting cabals.

South Africa is not alone as this phase of growth is a universal pattern being rolled out across the continent and in cannabis.

Morocco is reported in the United Nations Post Covid-19 World Drug report as the number one exporter of what is termed illegal cannabis out of Africa, it therefore comes as no surprise that mobilization is underway in the Northern corners of the continent. The ruling council on the top end of the continent has taken blue-chip routes to formalising the thriving cannabis production in the North African country whilst promising an improved clamp down on illegal grows.

The change in the approach in Morocco comes with the inception of the Cannabis Activities Regulatory Agency (ANRAC) under the chairmanship of the Interior Minister Abdelouafi Laftit. The organisation that is positioning as a cannabis watch dog in the country held their first gathering in the month of June highlighting the immediate mandates of the organization as well as the areas of operation and the application thereof.

One of the bones to chew for ANRAC in their first official sitting was the review of Law 13.21, aimed at strengthening the structural framework for the legal use of cannabis in Morocco. In a pattern similar to the common thread knitting across legalisation fronts in Africa, Morocco has also approached the plant at a face value level of medicinal and industrial cannabis.

These frameworks continue to free the plant for many whilst still keeping the many behind bars. The compensations of conflicts in desired pardon for those serving time for affiliation with the plant stands at higher levels of resistance. A free plant to profit and a pathway to prison sentences for illegal participation; rubber stamp that too Morocco.

Howbeit, as ANRAC positions itself as a public institution that in the bone chewing encounter defined a part of their mandate as referenced in this text. The weighty gold is in noting that the cannabis licenses will be issued by decree in the three Douars provinces in Morocco that are pioneering in the legal cannabis grow front. Geographically one considers that Morocco has 62 provinces which combine to make up 12 regions, a suggestion that the journey for legal cannabis is still at its infancy in the country. The ethos is also an awareness that it was in 2021 or rather last year when the adoption into legal cannabis routes was officialised in Morocco and the roll out of such a mandate within a Gregorian calendar cycle is commendable.

In the authorising decree ANRAC has been mandated with the task "of encouraging investment in this field, the decree entrusts the National Agency for the Regulation of Cannabis Activities with the task of assisting license applicants and facilitating the

implementation of administrative procedures related to granting the license, in accordance with the provisions of the mentioned law, and in close coordination with all the parties concerned".

That is chairs in Morocco in the North in the opposite front we look at cannabis executives down in Southern Africa which is the block that seems to be pioneering on the Cannabis business front with most nations in the trade block dancing with Bhang. Could it be the time for SADC to formulate a Cannabis Panel for the region? As notable ganja strains prevail across most of the states in the region, frankly the roots of the healing herb are firmly entrenched, Malawi Gold, Swazi Gold in the Kingdom of eSwatini, Gwamba Valley in Zimbabwe and Durban Poison in South Africa the nest stands for peeking deeper into what lies within cannabis and cultures in southern Africa.

Now to South Africa Garth Strachan was appointed as the head of the Cannabis Desk in the Office of the Presidency, Strachan who prior to taking up the call to cannabis framework has headed the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) his resignation at the time was sudden and termed as a conflict on the morphing direction of SABS. The Cannabis industry in South Africa seeks clear direction and is morphing on three fronts simultaneously, the industrial, medicinal and recreational fronts are all aligning for coming conflicts of dominance.

Strachan has also served as the Trade

and Industry deputy director general in South Africa and coupling that with SABS standardisation and export framework he appears as a hand and glove match in the much desired export front. Will Strachan be the key that will unlock the gates to the pathway the Presidency and National Treasury seek to unveil with Operation Vulindlela? Time will tell right, Bob Marley.

In the moment Strachan carries the academic badges in qualifications and experience, considering he holds a Masters Degree in public policy and has served both in Gauteng and Cape Town at provincial government level, the broad reach in governing frameworks at grassroots levels on both fronts' rings what would be an expert in office. Gauteng and Cape Town compete on cannabis fronts, said or otherwise the unofficial battle for dominance details the shadow work as both of the

provinces approach the cannabis industry.

Cannabis is a plant that is disrupting industries and calls for an approach not shy of ingenious innovation when the actioning commences. The varying legal frameworks across all different states fishing in the weed pond is a watershed marker stating in red letters that this cannabis industry does not need a bread and butter approach; maybe approaching it as slime is a fitting reference, it can be slippery, jittery but when handled by a master grower the results can be sublime. Still on the appointment dime we check out with a gaze into the private cannabis organisational moves remaining in South Africa this puff leads us to Dr. Ahmed Jamalooden who was appointed by the Union as the National Commodity Board Chairman of Cannabis and All Indigenous Flora. Speaking on his appointment into the office Dr. Ahmed stated that "I had the distinct honor of accepting the appointment of National Commodity Board Chairman of Cannabis and



Indigenous Flora in the Country of South Africa. What full Union support means is enablement". Dr. Jamalooden has been primarily active on the cannabis front from its early days and with a five thousand

hectare farm in Newcastle he is on the front foot when talking upscaling cannabis production in South Africa. Dr. J as he is known in the cannabis circles of South Africa is not new to cannabis organograms *continued on next page*

Farmers Association of South Africa). Primarily if some of these appointments can speak to enablement for the plant and not people of the plant, there could be misplaced hope for the everyday man consuming cannabis and seeking to be positioned in the capitance of cannabis.

The Morocco decree speaks of legal access and the defining of roles and routes to the acquisition of operational licenses; Garth Strachan joins the South African Presidency Desk to lead a framework that is calling for inclusion for the economically marginalized in the cannabis industry with "Operation Vulindlela" as on another corner within the same South Africa Dr. Ahmed Jamalooden speaks in plain text to enablement and the thrust that may be realized with Marijuana synergies.

If these corner offices and high rise buildings are set up to enable the reach of the cannabis plant, then this maybe another win for the plant but that victory needs not to emerge without the people of cannabis. The ones that have soldiered with the plant and the ones that have paid the price in the criminalisation of the blunt.

KANNAWAY DOCKS INTO SOUTH AFRICA

Kannaway a Multi-Level Marketing (MLM) organisation founded in the United States in 2009 as the direct selling subsidiary of Medical Marijuana, Inc., has opened offices and a warehouse in Johannesburg. Duduzile Mathole, Kannaway Country Manager for South Africa, stated that the "new office and warehouse is just our first step to greater expansion throughout Africa".

The Kannaway vision is that of "hemp in every home" a theme modelled after the ancient order of quota

systems enforcing hemp plants in farms. The South African cannabis market is ripe for picking and the establishment of Kannaway indicates that there is promise in the pathway of legalisation in the country.

Kannaway positioned itself as one of the pioneers in breaking the stigma and rolling out CBD products across the American populace, considering the global footprint of the organisation and the year on year growth reported by the organisation, the signals are that of confidence in the pathway to overcome prohibition of cannabis in South Africa. Kannaway has always played it safe with the herb dwelling on the medicinal front and focusing deeply on the non-psychoactive wing of cannabis CBD.

In November 2021 the company announced its intentions to establish a presence in South Africa at a convention held in San Diego with the subsequent appointment of Adriaan Pieterse who now serves as the companies first ever International Director. In referencing to the positioning of Kannaway in South Africa Pieterse recalls words uttered

in commitment to the Kannaway mandate in the country stating that "a few months ago I said that we would continue to "Gooi Mielies" (scattering the seeds (corn) of success in Afrikaans), and we have done just that. But we've only just started!"

The start has been lined by the planned city tour of South Africa which commenced in Cape Town with the flagship event designed "to serve as a premier networking opportunity for entrepreneurs to learn how they can get involved in South Africa's emerging cannabis industry". Pieterse who formulated part of the high powered delegation addressing the Regional Event relayed his enthusiasm remarking that "It has been an amazing experience working with Kannaway and I look forward to speaking with current and potential entrepreneurs at the event about how I've found success with the company and how they can too,".

Kannaway a member of the US Hemp Authority manufactures and markets some of the world's most important wellness innovations, sourced from cannabis, Kannaway's flagship products range from Pure Liquid, Pure Gold, Pure Gold Soft Gels, Salve, and FastStart Junior Executive Value Pack. Kannaway arrives in South Africa to a nation already seasoned with MLM organisation and whilst everything exists in balance the arrival of the organisation may position as low hanging fruit for retailers interested in pushing product numbers. The organisation has a nine level compensation plan that rewards affiliates on retail and downline operations.

The time for monopoly in cannabis approaches a new beginning and yet in the same breath an end as opportunities of involvement in the cannabis front are emerging on differing fronts.

Landing as an official network marketing organisation of cannabis products, Kannaway has been on the ascendency with consideration of the

numbers and the points of distribution positioned across the globe. The win for South Africa could also emerge in the formulation of a value chain that could see a potential client for the marijuana green matter; the red flags in investments is the establishment of distribution channels in the absence of grassroots input to the products in discussion. A processing and packaging facility would further hinge more value for the cannabis plant and economy in South Africa consuming part of the ganja that has flooded the "illegal" market in the country.

In the synergies communicated by the organisation the advancement into the production and processing of cannabis needs emerge with the same zeal communicated by Kannaway International Director Adriaan Pieterse as he remarks that "I'm not going to tell you it's a walk in the park, but my team are all going together in the same direction which is what is at the very heart of our momentum - a strong team, with a big vision and a mission with a purpose". The same heart drive must need be positioned to propel local production and processing of cannabis, as the dagga economy of South Africa calls to be positioned more for full cycle value systems, product beneficiation and with a strong lobby encouraging the development and value addition approach that eliminates the mentality and roles of being consumers of external products and exporters of raw green matter.

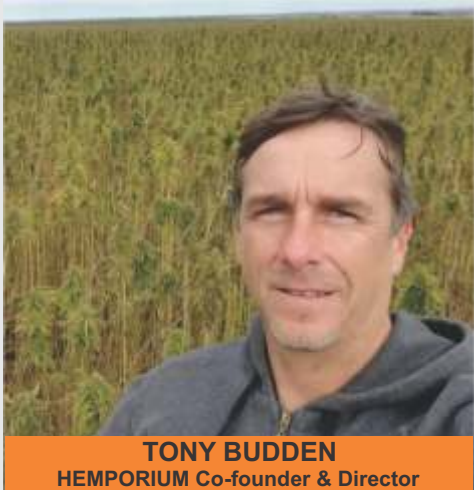
CANNABIS EXPO RETURNS TO DURBAN
