TEARS OF THE SAME COLOUR

he Rastafari United Front (RUF) has not slowed down on the fight for the rights against the plight of the Rasta. This past Monday in South Africa in the Northern Cape province town of Kimberly the trademarkely clad Rasta coloured the pavements of the town in another push. The red, green and gold lions led by Ras Thau-Thau Haramanuba, the President of the RUF marched to the Kimberley Magistrate Court in protest.

The Rastafari United Front was flagged by communities echoing on the similar fundamentals in the Black Farmers Association of South Africa (BFASA), Cannabis Development Council of South Africa (CDCSA) and the Marcus Garvey Orthodox movement.

Whilst heralded as a protest in paramount pushing against police brutality the memorandum of demands sounded and handed to the state officials by the RUF president speaks specifics in systematic and functional demands talking into the dynamic that informed not only the march but the memorandum of demands as penned by the organisations roped in together with the RUF.

Reading out the ninth and pivotal demand that themed the protest march Ras Thau-Thau echoed the black words on the white paper stating that, "the justice system should be called to the fore to pay attention to this continued gross human rights violation twenty-seven years after constitutional democracy".

The Rasta are side walk echoing a voice

that needs be noted in that almost three decades later their fight for fairness and the fusion of the Rasta culture is still helming on the garment of lady liberty. The demands echo the basics brutalised in the beef between the band of brothers and the bud of beauty in the last sixty years. News of the harassments of Rasta even to death at the hands of the law enforcement officials is an unwelcome norm in this age.

In December 2019 the Capetown family of Jan de Bruin witnessed what would be a nourishing family gathering turn into a nightmare when Jan de Bruin was taken from the gathering by state officials after a scuffle, only for the family to receive news of his passing the following day. CannaXpress caught up with the Dr. Lennox Mtshagi the President BFASA who formulated the flagship coupling in with the RUF for the protest march. Dr. Lennox gives clarity on what the role of BFASA and interest in the march is informed by remarking that "injustices are taking place in the cannabis community and there is a lot of brutality by police happening on our members. We also want to expose the capture of cannabis by the South African Health Product Regulatory Authority (SAHPRA)". The standoff between BFASA and SAHPRA has been televised literally and the fires are still blazing as boiled out in the words of Dr. Lennox Mtshagi as he further states that "there is a lot of red tapes that SAHPRA has put in so that Africans cannot access the cannabis

market. Africans were also excluded from the pharmaceutical industry. The exclusion is done using an Apartheid act of 1965; by not abiding by the Constitution of South Africa which the preamble stipulates very clearly that all black South Africans that were previously oppressed should be prioritised in all government businesses. SAHPRA does not use the BEE, they are giving the cannabis to white monopoly capital".

On a televised weigh in on Newzroom Afrika Dr. Lennox Mtshagi squared off with the SAHPRA CEO Dr. Boitumelo Semete-Makokotlela, the gist of the matter ending with the absence of proof for submissions on corruption claims against SAHPRA by BFASA. The BFASA president took the moment with CannaXpress

question on the televised weigh in stating that "we are having proof of all corrupt activities taking place at SAHPRA".

Outside of all the theatrical works of human interaction however the energy, the ethos is that there remains work to be done to facilitate the desired changes from the rolled out channels, twenty-seven years into a state walk, cries of the cannabis communities' echo a universal plea that is in most cases a lifetime pursuit for most. For in this moment it sounds from the roots of a spiritual ganja plant and yet in truth it is housed in the hearts of everyday people that is the cry, the cry for the cognitive realisation of the self from the Rasta to the superstar, the master to the mastered the tears remain the same colour.





omo Segage is the leader of Middelburg and Hendrina Residents Front (MHRF) political party in Middleburg South Africa, the CannaXpress caught up with the man who ran as the Mayoral candidate for his party to chat about all things cannabis. Jomo narrates his journey with ganja stating that run-ins with the law enforcers and academic educators was a norm in his teenage years. He speaks to the constitutional ruling of September in 2018 indicating that the ruling positioned an initial breakthrough for the cannabis masses in South Africa. "That is a breakthrough because for almost all my life I have been advocating for the decriminalisation of marijuana," he stated the vibrant Jomo. MHRF was formed on the 7th of November in 2020 after concerned members of the Middelburg and Hendrina communities in the Steve Tshwete local municipality felt that their interests of preserving the heritage of the

town were no longer represented by the current political parties. In the recent local government elections in South Africa Jomo led the Mpumalanga province party as the Mayoral candidate for the party in the town of standing for the Middleburg. Jomo a Rasta since his teenage years led the novice party to a haul of 11% of the total voter turnout as 10337 votes, a feat that led the MHRF to acquire 7 seats in the Steve Tshwete Local Municipality. With the leading party acquiring just over 36% and no outright majority the municipal Council in Middleburg Mpumalanga remains hung awaiting coalition talks. Jomo Segage closes on the political front with a remark that has been the waking song in the party slogan "our heritage we defend because we could not sit and watch our town's resources being looted like in such a manner."

evironn Felix @cannagrowsome from Cape Town always been a cannabis smoker my entire life, since I was a child in the hood.

"Always been into weed, sitting with the Rastafari's from the beginning," he said. Felix left the country in 2013 to go cook high-end clients in the US and started growing weed on the side.

By 2018 Felix returned back to local soil after the bill was passed.

He said he wanted to do something that brings about change especially because his mother had a stigma towards the plant

So Felix started out relationship consulting and dabbed himself as a cannabis relationship consultant "My mommy was very against my use. I developed a triple scale where I measure the analysis for personality for the person with weed and the anticannabis person (the person they would like to amend with)," he said. Felix has all sorts of methods he uses to amend the relationship so that the person can use cannabis in their own personal capacity without hiding and being ashamed of who they are. That work got him noticed by Cheeba who invited him to do various talks at

the campus.

He not only helps people grow in their relationships but also shares his knowledge of the plant and its basics.

"I have a passion for the educational side of it," Felix said.

He said when Cheeba opened its campus he was first in line to join to share his

Now living in Johannesburg, and has been working as the cultivation manager at Cheeba from March until September.


He is also involved in the private sector and the Waterberg Eco project a community drive project to help build community centers for women.

PICKING A GROW MEDIUM

Choosing the right growing medium for your crop is crucial to a great yield. Here, Southern Magnetism we will share what we consider before we choose any container or substrate.

While there are a number of laboratory tests for physical characterization of growing medium, the three most familiar measurements are bulk density (weight), water holding capacity and air porosity. Water holding capacity is the volume percentage of water retained by a saturated growing after it is allowed to drain. Air porosity is a measurement of the volume of pore space occupied by air after a saturated growing medium is allowed to drain. For the most part, peat-based growing media products have a low bulk density, since the majority are made with a base of Sphagnum peat moss and have higher water holding capacity. Bark-based media are heavy weight products that are suitable when high drainage and container stability are required. Both types of products typically

have good air porosity in a range of 10 - 18% by volume, which is a good range for most growing media.

Choosing the optimal growing media (substrate) requires special consideration, because it is much more than just an anchor for the plant: it can be crucial to successful crop

A balance between air content and available water is one of the most important requirements of a good growing media.

There are many advantages to using a growing medium


- *High yields can be achieved on a limited area
- *Better control over Irrigation and fertilization
- *Easier disinfection
- *Recycling of drainage water is
- *Growing media can be used as an alternative to an inadequate soil.

However, growing media also have some disadvantages, such as:

- *Nutrient holding capacity of growing media is low
- *Buffer capacity is low and therefore changes are rapid



The MHRF leader Segage swings onto the other pole talking cannabis and legislation "I grew up knowing that it is just a plant that it is created by the Creator and I understood that I could only use it for the purposes of medical and recreational use, however I strongly condemn the abuse of ganja by some. Since decriminalisation I now use cannabis for recreation without the fear of being arrested by cops. It is also exciting in the current cannabis makeup as there now exists in a sense route ways of commercialisation and entry into the cannabis space" stated Jomo as he manoeuvred the dynamics with the political swerve of compliance. Reaching out on the sore points that characterise the

current legislative framework Segage indicated his disdain displayed by law enforcers stating that he is troubled by lack of education around cannabis which manifests in the form of brutality by some members of the law enforcement agencies.

"I have a very serious problem with the incidents of brutality that have been surfacing even after the September 2018 ruling. They have been happening in most parts of the country, what becomes interesting is that many of these cases you find that police have

made arrests and then when the suspects get to court, the case is struck off the roll because of lack of sufficient evidence to continue with prosecution or technical discrepancies that normally hinge on fact obliviousness by the law enforcers, that tells us that the members of the law enforcement agencies have been properly ed when it comes new legalities regard to bis," Segage jded.



Swazi gold is mostly grown illegally by senior citizens in Nhlangano.Women dominate the farming in what is known locally as the 'gardens of Eden'. The 'gold' is grown in over 16 plots hidden away in the mountains surrounding the small village.

Nondu Noncedo Kunene a 70 year old resident of the Nhlangano said to CannaXpress that, "You see, this issue of us (black people) breaking the law by farming cannabis has always been there. I do not care what they say because we have doing this for generations. It is my family's lifeblood."

Kunene went on to say that, "Swazi gold is most popular with the truck drivers coming from South Africa. They want it a lot. We sell to them all the time because they are also selling it in Mpumalanga and other places like Johannesburg."

of Swazi gold in Nhlanganani said to Africa, clients can sometimes tell one CannaXpress that, "I encourage younger that the grade of the cannabis is subwomen to start farming this cash crop standard, pushing one to sell at a lower within the confines of the law. They also need to get involved in processing and exporting our Swazi gold."

Khumalo went on to say that, "We sent them to school and now it is their turn to take this a step further by changing the laws and unlocking more of what we already have."

> The Swazi gold is sold on the South African streets from as much as R1/g between 8 to 10 Rand in South Africa and Mozambique, where it is resold to end users at inflated rates. Reportedly Manguya, a women in the village has said that, "Yes, we farm the Swazi gold. I have been in this marijuana business for 11 years. My garden of Eden spares us from dying of hunger. Children have something to wear, something to eat every day, and our lives have become better."

It is hard being a woman in a country where policies do not prioritise the welfare of women and children," she went to say. Narrating the resell options the indication is that the market is in South Africa but even when one Zodwa Khumalo another Swazi gold farmer manages to cross the border into South price or to look for other clients.

> In the village of Mashobeni, cannabis grows with ease and has become the locals' cash crop. Since 2020 in the village under the prevailing lockdown regulations, locals spent most of their time in the gardens tending to the

cannabis plants.

In Mashobeni village, Nonduduzo Mbenyu has been farming Swazi gold and smuggling it to South Africa for decades she lives with her late mother's sister. Her aunt's cannabisgarden pays for her education.

"I have sent my children to school all the way to University in South Africa farming and selling this cannabis plant. It is a blessing to us and I wish that my children will use the skills and knowledge to advance their lives as well. There is a lot of money with plant. It is only that we are ruled by an unreasonable man, otherwise we would be somewhere by now," Mbenyu added.

"Communities resort to illegal means of survival because the government of King Mswati III has played a prominent role in institutionalising poverty," he says.

"The government has stunted the country's economic development and failed to build a broad based competitive economy, relying only on foreign direct investment for development. This has resulted in an increased rate of unemployment and degeneration of public institutions, such as the health sector," said Sibusiso Siyaya, spokesperson for eSwatini's People's United Democratic Movement.

A Ministry of Agriculture official who spoke on condition of anonymity,

argued that the geographical location of eSwatini contributed to the economic challenges.

"eSwatini is a landlocked, mountainous country with limited aerable land for our people to utilise for feeding their families or for commercial purposes. As for marijuana farming, I understand the police have dealt with criminal elements who wanted to contaminate our communities. It's all under control," he says.

The opposition party dismisses this explanation saying that, "It is not true that eSwatini doesn't have enough land for farming. The country has idle land said to belong to the king. The country needs to redress past injustices of a system that sought to enrich a few at the expense of the majority, in particular women and the youth."

Currently, there is only one legal eSwatini cannabis grower; the United States based Profile Solutions Inc which has a licence to grow and process medical cannabis and hemp for a minimum

However, despite the risks, the Swazi gold farmers do not want to join the legal market. Reportedly, Mbenyu is on record saying that, "Legalising weed might be a threat to our market, as prices might drop. We want the current situation to remain in place."

The Album opens up with a synergy of an amapiano, house and afrobeats fusion tracks from Sesingenile to Labangane promising to be hit across the face of Africa. PICKING A GROW MEDIUM





Growing medium components are either organic or inorganic. Organic components include, but are not limited to: peat moss, bark, coconut coir, rice hulls, wood fiber, etc. Inorganic components include, but are not limited to: perlite, pumice, vermiculite, sand, hydrogel, etc. Some of these components hold water on their surface, while others hold water on their surface and within their structure, and others hold very little, if any water, such as perlite. Keep in mind that a specific type of ingredient can vary in its water holding capacity and physical structure, depending on its origin and how it is processed. For example, bark can vary greatly in its source and its structure depending on how it is processed, aged, composted and screened. This is also true for peat moss. Light brown, fibrous peat moss has a porous structure and can hold up 16 times its weight in water. However, if this same peat moss is processed

into fine particles, the water holding

capacity can be reduced and the air porosity decreased dramatically. If you blend your own growing media, your source materials should be consistent to produce a quality and predictable growing medium. It is important to know the structure, chemical and physical properties of the ingredients you use to be sure that the growing medium blend you produce is the same, batch after batch.

Most commercial growing media are pH adjusted with either calcitic or dolomitic limestone and contain a balanced starter fertilizer to help plants acclimate after planting. It is generally recommended to begin fertilization once new plant leaves begin to emerge and new roots develop. The amount of fertilizer and frequency of applications will vary based on the crop type, stage of development, container size and frequency of plain water applications. Keep in mind that some ingredients used in formulating growing media may contain mineral salts, such as coir. It is recommended that coir should be leached thoroughly before use to be reduce salt levels and potentially high nutrients (i.e.: potassium, chloride, sodium). The same is true for bark, since aging and composting can release undesirable elements. To be sure, laboratory tests are recommended to check pH, E.C. and individual nutrient levels.
